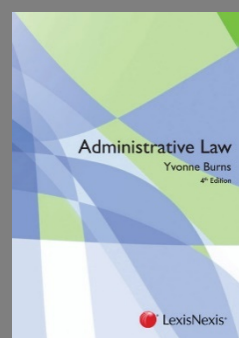
Competition rules:
